Annamária Orbán is an associate professor at the Department of Sociology and Communication and a senior research fellow at the Department of Urban Planning and Design of Budapest University of Technology and Economics (BME), has an MA in Economics and earned her PhD in Political Science at the Central European University in 2003. She is a founding member of the Centre for Socio-Spatial Development Studies (CSSDS) at the BME Department of Sociology and Communication and has been the Scientific and International Affairs Vice Dean of the BME Faculty of Economics and Social Sciences in 2012-2014. Her teaching, as well as research interests are multidisciplinary: ranging from economic sociology through comparative and international studies to European politics, while her main field of research interests are cooperation, trust, social capital, sustainable local/urban development, energy politics, social economy, self-help community models, urban nature, social and cultural innovations, inter-generational solidarity. She is a senior research fellow and MC member of the EU Interreg “DANURB” (2017/19) project lead by BME Department of Urban Planning and Design, where she is a senior research fellow.
